POST-MASTER'S CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS AT THE MOUNT

Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner (A-GNP) Certificate

Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner (ANP) Certificate program prepares nurses to deliver primary care to adults and the elderly. The emphasis of the program is on health promotion, prevention of illness, maintenance of health status, and management of acute episodic and stable chronic conditions.

Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) Certificate

The Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) Certificate program prepares nurses to deliver primary care to clients across the life span and their families in a variety of settings. The emphasis of the program is on health promotion, prevention of illness, maintenance of health status and management of acute episodic and stable chronic conditions.

Certificate in Nursing Education

The Certificate in Nursing Education program prepares nurses to teach nursing at various levels within academic and practice settings. The emphasis of the program is on nursing education organization, role development, curriculum development, instructional methodologies, and evaluation.
